ABOUT THE WISCONSIN SHIPWRECK COAST NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY

Designated in 2021, Wisconsin Shipwreck Coast National Marine Sanctuary provides stewardship for our nation’s maritime heritage in Lake Michigan, including 40 historic shipwreck sites. Co-managed by NOAA and the state of Wisconsin, the sanctuary expands on the state’s 30-year management of these historic sites, bringing new opportunities for research, resource protection, and education. In partnership with local communities, the sanctuary provides a national stage for promoting recreation and heritage tourism.

The sanctuary is part of NOAA’s National Marine Sanctuary System, an over 620,000 square mile network of underwater parks. These special places protect some of the most iconic underwater areas in the United States.
